



An antique architectural complex on the northeast side of Haizhu lake - the new venue of the Guangzhou Cultural Center which will be put into use soon. Situated at the southern end of the city's central axis, this venue was designed as a Lingnan-style garden. The buildings are scattered around the Haizhu lake like stones and assembled into various courtyards, forming a layout of "a garden within a garden". Meanwhile, the typical landscape elements of the Lingnan region, "mountains, rivers, fields, and ponds", are integrated into the design of the venue.

Furthermore, the center integrates public performances, training, exhibitions, creation, research and exchanges, protection and inheritance of intangible cultural heritage, and other functions, which will become a landmark of Guangzhou.

From the 18th to 19th century, this district-known as the "Thirteen Factories"—saw tea, silk and porcelain shipped to Europe, while silver, clocks and textiles arrived in return. The museum covers an area of 3,060 square meters and has a total construction area of 6,090 square meters. There are more than 2,300 pieces of cultural relics in it, showing the history of thirteen lines in the form of "cultural relics + historical documents".



Taikoo Wharf, established by the British Swire Company between 1904 and 1908, was a major shipbuilding and port facility in Guangzhou, playing a key role in the city's maritime trade and extending the legacy of the Maritime Silk Road. The dockyard included concrete T-shaped docks and brick-and-wood warehouses to handle large cargo vessels operated by Swire's shipping company. Today, the century-old wharf has been transformed into a vibrant cultural park, combining heritage with creativity, dining, exhibitions, design studios, a cinema, yacht club, and boutique hotel, celebrated as Guangzhou's "city parlor."

Originally built during the Ming dynasty as part of Guangzhou's expansion under Zhu Liangzu, the tower rises five square-shaped storeys, earning it the local name "Five-Storied Tower." Today, the museum houses an extensive collection of historical artifacts reflecting Guangzhou's rich past, from ancient times through the city's development as a major trading hub. Its exhibitions offer insights into local culture, architecture, and customs, providing a comprehensive insight into the heritage and history of Guangzhou.

The Nanhai God Temple, also known as the "Bolo Temple," is the only surviving one of China's four ancient sea temples and a significant site in Guangzhou's maritime trade history. Ships passing through the nearby wharf often stopped to offer sacrifices, praying for safe voyages. The temple complex, with its head gate. ceremonial gate, main hall, apse and side corridors, is complete and architecturally magnificent, featuring stone carvings dating back to the Sui and Tang dynasties. Renowned as the "Southern Forest of Steles." it also hosts the annual Nanhai Divine Festival, a lively celebration of culture and seafaring tradition.



Today, remnants of the ancient docks and surrounding streets evoke the city's seafaring past, offering insight into the scale and sophistication of maritime trade that shaped the region for centuries.




